

**Total Circulation Per Capita LFY2018**



Program Attendance Per Capita LFY2018



# Volunteer Hours Comparison


Annual Volunteer Hours LFY2018



## Q1 The Bedford Public Library is meeting my library needs.















He stated there would be no need to tear up parking lots and curbs nor transplant trees if the Senior Center is left where it is.

Mr. Overstreet presented information regarding this item, which is to renew the contract with Curtco, Inc. He stated the City seals cracks in roadways every year to prevent water invasion and preserve the pavement. The City has utilized Curtco, Inc. the previous two years. Funding for this contract was approved by the Street Improvement Development Corporation (SIEDC) Board and the City Council as part of the budget process. In response to questions from Council, Mr. Overstreet stated a certified inspector is assigned to verify the company's work.

Motioned by Councilmember Fisher, seconded by Councilmember Sabol, to approve a resolution authorizing the City Manager to renew the agreement with Curtco, Inc., utilizing the City of Grand Prairie's Joint and Crack Sealing Services contract, through the Master Interlocal Cooperative Purchasing Agreement, in the amount of \$150,000, for the 2020 Joint and Crack Sealing Services Program.

Motion approved 7-0-0. Mayor Boyter declared the motion carried.

**5. Consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to purchase 25 AI-500-085-02 Series Glance Preempt and Priority Field Monitoring Units (FMU) for traffic signals through Paradigm Traffic Systems, in the amount of \$220,000, utilizing the BuyBoard Cooperative Purchasing Agreement.**

Mr. Overstreet presented information regarding this item, which is for a new preempt system allowing communication between all traffic signals and the traffic control system at the Public Works Service Center. The current system relies on radios, which are failing due to outdated equipment and technology, and is hampered by line-of-site problems. The new system uses cellular-based technology and is plug-and-play, allowing for new features to be added in the future such as detection cameras and a preempt system for emergency vehicles. He discussed other cities adopting the technology, including Euless. He stated there are 26 traffic signals in the City, and one signal damaged previously has the new unit installed. In response to questions from Council, Mr. Overstreet stated upgrades to the antennas on the water tower and the radio system are still needed for the supervisory control and data acquisition (SCADA) system. There was discussion on the impact of the new system on the congestion at Cheek-Sparger Road and Glade Parks. Mr. Overstreet stated the City would continue to use the Opticom system for emergency vehicles.

Motioned by Councilmember Culver, seconded by Councilmember Cogan, to approve a resolution authorizing the City Manager to purchase 25 AI-500-085-02 Series Glance Preempt and Priority Field Monitoring Units (FMU) for traffic signals through Paradigm Traffic Systems, in the amount of \$220,000, utilizing the BuyBoard Cooperative Purchasing Agreement.

Motion approved 7-0-0. Mayor Boyter declared the motion carried.

**6. Consider a resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into a professional services agreement with Half Associates, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$60,000, for miscellaneous engineering services.**

Mr. Overstreet presented information regarding this item. He stated the Public Works engineer retired and therefore, there is no one on staff to review plans and perform other engineering functions. Staff negotiated with Half Associates to act as the City's engineer and provide professional engineering services until a new engineer is hired. She discussed the previous amendments to the contract with Halff Associates, including title work for the Clubhouse for Special Needs property and the arts facility at the Old Bedford School. She stated the amendment requires asbestos testing of each facility and structure scheduled to be removed at the Boys Ranch Park prior to destruction. In response to questions from Council, Ms. Sylo stated it would take approximately one month to get back the test results. Halff has a certified lab that does the testing, and staff looked at other companies' qualifications prior to selecting Halff Associates. Once the testing is complete, the City would receive a report on how to contain and treat any asbestos found. Ms. Sylo did not believe the testing would add additional time to the project.

**ITEM:**

Consider an ordinance of the City of Bedford amending Chapter 42, "Courts" of the City of Bedford Code of Ordinances by amending and replacing Sections 42-36 to 42-39 relative to the assessment and collection of reimbursement fees and court costs; providing a cumulative clause; providing a severability clause; providing a savings clause; and establishing an effective date.

**City Attorney Review:** Yes

**SUMMARY:**

This item is to update the City of Bedford Code of Ordinances to match state legislation, which went into effect on January 1, 2020, as well as clean up language in the Code repealed by that legislation. The attached ordinance amends Chapter 42, "Courts" by amending Section 42-36 "Building security fund" and Section 42-37 "Municipal Court technology fund," and adding Section 42-38 "Juvenile case manager; local truancy prevention and diversion fund" and Section 42-39 "Municipal jury fund."

**BACKGROUND:**

Senate Bill 346 went into effect on January 1, 2020. The legislation of SB 346 repealed all of the statutes that set forth the municipal court costs and reorganized the allocation of those costs into one statute: Local Government Code Section 134.103 – "Local Consolidated Fee on Conviction of Nonjailable Misdemeanor."

Local Government Code Section 134.103 provides as follows:

- (a) A person convicted of a nonjailable misdemeanor offense, including a criminal violation of a municipal ordinance, shall pay \$14 as a court cost, in addition to all other costs, on conviction.
- (b) The treasurer shall allocate the court costs received under this section to the following accounts and funds so that each receives to the extent practicable, utilizing historical data as applicable, the same amount of money the account or fund would have received if the court costs for the accounts and funds had been collected and reported separately, except that the account or fund may not receive less than the following percentages:
  - 1. The courthouse security fund or municipal court building security fund, as appropriate – 35 percent.
  - 2. The local truancy prevention and diversion fund – 35.7143 percent.
  - 3. The justice court technology fund or municipal court technology fund as appropriate – 28.5714 percent.
  - 4. The county or municipal jury fund, as appropriate – 0.7143 percent.

The authorized use of those funds is set forth in various statutes. The Texas Municipal Courts Education Center has created the synopsis below that is instructive in that regard.

- 1. **Municipal Court Building Security Fund – Article 102.017, Code of Criminal Procedure, 35%, \$4.90, May only be used for security personnel, services, and items related to buildings that**

house the operation of municipal court. A non-exhaustive list of potential uses is included in Article 102.017 (c), Code of Criminal Procedure.

2. Local Truancy Prevention and Diversion Fund – Section 133.125, Local Government Code, 35.7143%, \$5.00, May only be used to finance the salary, benefits, training, travel expenses, office supplies, and other necessary expenses to the position of juvenile case manager. Money may not be used to supplement the income of an employee whose primary role is not juvenile case manager.
3. Municipal Court Technology Fund – Article 102.0172, Code of Criminal Procedure, 28.5714%, \$4.00, May only be used to finance the purchase of or to maintain technological enhancements for a municipal court. A non-exhaustive list of potential uses is included in Article 102.0172 (b), Code of Criminal Procedure.
4. Municipal Jury Fund – Section 134.154, Local Government Code, 0.7143%, \$0.10, May only be used by municipality to fund juror reimbursements and otherwise finance jury services.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends the following motion:

Approval of an ordinance of the City of Bedford amending Chapter 42, “Courts” of the City of Bedford Code of Ordinances by amending and replacing Sections 42-36 to 42-39 relative to the assessment and collection of reimbursement fees and court costs; providing a cumulative clause; providing a severability clause; providing a savings clause; and establishing an effective date.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

Additional revenue for the Municipal Court Building Security Fund is estimated at \$19,000.

Revenue for the Local Truancy Prevention and Diversion Fund is estimated at \$50,000.

Revenue for the Municipal Jury Fund is estimated at \$1,000.

**ORDINANCE NO. 2020-**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BEDFORD AMENDING CHAPTER 42, "COURTS" BY AMENDING AND REPLACING SECTIONS 42-36 to 42-39 RELATIVE TO THE ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION OF REIMBURSEMENT FEES AND COURT COSTS; PROVIDING A CUMULATIVE CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS, the City of Bedford (the "City") is a Home Rule municipality having full powers of self-government and may enact ordinances relative to its citizens' health, safety, and welfare that are not inconsistent with the Constitution and laws of the State; and,**

**WHEREAS, the City has created a Municipal Court of record, having concurrent jurisdiction with the justice court in criminal cases that arise in the City and that are punishable by fine only; and,**

**WHEREAS, Senate Bill 346 of the 86th Legislature ("SB 346") consolidated and allocated criminal court costs contained in current law; and,**

**WHEREAS, SB 346 has a preemptive effect on ordinances adopted prior to its effective date of January 1, 2020; and,**

**WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that the fees and costs adopted by this ordinance are in compliance with the provisions and intent of SB 346, and are thus, revenue neutral to the greatest extent possible; and,**

**WHEREAS, all statutory and constitutional requirements for the passage of this ordinance have been adhered to, including but not limited to the Open Meetings Act.**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEDFORD, TEXAS:**

**SECTION 1. That the findings above are found to be true and correct and are incorporated herein.**

**SECTION 2. That Chapter 42, "Courts," Sections 42-36 to 42-39 are amended and replaced, which shall read as follows:**

**Sec. 42-36. – Municipal Court building security fund**

- (a) There is hereby created a Municipal Court building security fund.**
- (b) The Municipal Court building fund consists of money allocated to the funds under Texas Local Government Code Sections 134.103.**
- (c) The money deposited in the Municipal Court building security fund may be used to the extent permissible under state law.**

**Sec. 42-37. – Municipal Court technology fund**

- (a) There is hereby created a Municipal Court technology fund.**
- (b) The Municipal Court technology fund consists of money allocated to the funds under Texas Local Government Code Sections 134.103.**
- (c) The money deposited in the Municipal Court technology fund may be used to the extent permissible under state law.**

**ORDINANCE NO. 2020-**

**Sec. 42-38. – Juvenile case manager; local truancy prevention and diversion fund**

- a) The Municipal Court is authorized to employ one or more juvenile case managers who:
  - 1) shall assist the court in administering the court's juvenile docket and in supervising its court orders in juvenile cases; and,
  - 2) may provide prevention services to a child considered at-risk of entering the juvenile justice system and intervention services to juveniles engaged in misconduct prior to cases being filed, excluding traffic offenses.
- b) There is hereby created a local truancy prevention and diversion fund.
- c) The local truancy prevention and diversion fund consists of money allocated to the funds under Texas Local Government Code Sections 134.103.
- d) A fund created under this section may be used to the extent permissible under state law.

**Sec. 42-39 – Municipal jury fund**

- a) There is hereby created a municipal jury fund.
- b) The Municipal jury fund consists of money allocated to the funds under Texas Local Government Code Sections 134.103.
- c) The money deposited in the municipal jury fund may be used to the extent permissible under state law.

**SECTION 3.** That this Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other City Ordinances and all other provisions of other Ordinances adopted by the City which are inconsistent with the terms or provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 5.** That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage as the law in such case provides.

**SUMMARY:**

This item is to consider adopting the Tarrant County Hazard Mitigation Action Plan (HazMap). The multi-hazard mitigation plan is a FEMA initiative that seeks to reduce risk within the City by identifying potential, future mitigation strategies. Bedford previously participated in and adopted the Tarrant County HazMap in August of 2015. This would be a continued effort in participation in this updated plan and initiative. Adoption of this plan does not obligate the City to implement elements of the plan, only to consider elements of the plan during planning functions for future projects.

**BACKGROUND:**

The City cannot control when or where a tornado or other natural hazard will strike, however, steps can be taken to reduce the risks to the City. Lives can be protected and property damage can be minimized by understanding the risks and taking action to address them. Certain actions can increase the resilience in the community, environment, and economy. Since 2018, more than 30 Tarrant County jurisdictions and agencies have participated in the development of the Tarrant County Hazard Mitigation Action Plan (HazMAP) with the goal of reducing risk. The purpose of the plan is to give jurisdictions identified opportunities to implement initiatives that provide protection for local citizens and their property and to seek to improvement in the quality of life for all residents.

Mitigation is defined as sustained action to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to human life and property from natural, human-caused, and technological hazards. The plan is fundamentally a loss-prevention function characterized by planned, long-term alteration of the built environment to ensure resilience against natural and human-caused hazards. This loss-prevention function has been illustrated by the Multi-Hazard Mitigation Council study of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) mitigation projects, which shows that for every dollar invested in mitigation, six dollars of disaster losses were avoided.

The Tarrant County HazMAP identifies the hazards faced by participating jurisdictions, vulnerabilities to these hazards, and mitigation strategies for the future. The plan fulfills the requirements of the Federal Disaster Mitigation Act as administered by the Texas Division of Emergency Management and FEMA.

Adoption of the Tarrant County Hazard Mitigation Action Plan (HazMAP) enables the City to consider mitigation strategies as part of project planning activities. The City is not obligated to fund strategies contained within the plan rather, the plan serves to guide the City's planning of future abatement of risk from natural and human-made threats. Additionally, participation in the plan's construction and ultimate adoption, makes the City eligible for certain future mitigation grants through FEMA and the North Central Texas Council of Governments.

**SUMMARY:**

This item is to request approval to enter into an interlocal agreement with Tarrant County to complete an asphalt overlay on Brown Trail and Forest Ridge Drive. If approved, the City will be responsible for the cost of asphalt and reimbursement to Tarrant County for half of the County's fuel cost.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Public Works Department has worked with the staff of Tarrant County Precinct 3 to develop an interlocal agreement for street improvements on Forest Ridge Drive from SH 121/183 to Pipeline Road and Brown Trail from SH 121/183 to Bedford Road. If the interlocal agreement is approved, the City of Bedford will be responsible for the cost of the services for the projects described below:

- Hot Mix Asphalt Concrete (HMAC) overlay on Forest Ridge Drive from SH 121/183 to Pipeline Road for a total of 25,944 square yards and an estimated material cost of \$247,310.03.
- Hot Mix Asphalt Concrete (HMAC) overlay on Brown Trail from SH 121/183 to Bedford Road for a total of 10,702 square yards and an estimated material cost of \$82,429.

Per the agreement, the County will provide the labor and equipment necessary for the work on the proposed projects. The City agrees to provide actual material cost, half of the fuel cost, removal of the existing surface (e.g. roadway milling), traffic control, and signage. The estimated material cost for the overlay on both road sections is \$329,739.03. If the City were to bid this project, the cost for the overlay could exceed \$367,960. Having Tarrant County provide the labor and equipment for placing the HMAC will result in an estimated savings of \$38,220.97.

The project was approved by the Street Improvement Economic Development Corporation (SIEDC) at the July 16, 2019 meeting. Funding would come from the SIEDC (4B) fund.

If the interlocal agreement is approved, Tarrant County Precinct 3 intends to start the overlay beginning March 2, 2020.

**INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT**

**COUNTY OF TARRANT**

This Interlocal Agreement is between Tarrant County, Texas (“COUNTY”), and the City of Bedford (“CITY”).

WHEREAS, the CITY is requesting the COUNTY’s assistance to:

- Resurface Forest Ridge Drive located within the City of Bedford from SH 121/183 to Pipeline Road (Approximately 5,706 linear feet).
- Resurface Brown Trail located within the City of Bedford from SH 121/183 to Bedford Road (Approximately 1,720 linear feet).

Hereinafter, collectively referred to as the “**Project**”.

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Cooperation Act contained in Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code provides legal authority for the parties to enter into this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, during the performance of the governmental functions and the payment for the performance of those governmental functions under this Agreement, the parties will make the performance and payment from current revenues legally available to that party; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of the COUNTY and the City Council of the CITY each make the following findings:

- a. This Agreement serves the common interests of both parties;
- b. This Agreement will benefit the public;
- c. The division of costs fairly compensates both parties to this Agreement; and
- d. The CITY and the COUNTY have authorized their representative to sign this Agreement.
- e. Both parties acknowledge that they are each a “governmental entity” and not a “business entity” as those terms are defined in Tex. Gov’t Code § 2252.908, and therefore, no disclosure of interested parties pursuant to Tex. Gov’t Code Section 2252.908 is required.

NOW, THEREFORE, the COUNTY and the CITY agree as follows:

## **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

### **1. COUNTY RESPONSIBILITY**

The COUNTY will furnish the labor and equipment to assist the CITY in completing the Project:

- Forest Ridge Drive: Following any pavement repairs and removal of the existing hot mix asphaltic surface by the CITY, the COUNTY will place two inches of asphalt surface and clean the project jobsite.
- Brown Trail: Following any pavement repairs and removal of the existing hot mix asphaltic surface by the CITY, the COUNTY will place two inches of asphalt surface and clean the project jobsite.

### **2. CITY RESPONSIBILITY**

- 2.1 The CITY will furnish and pay for the actual cost of the materials, including any delivery or freight cost. The CITY will provide a purchase order and will be billed directly by the material supplier. The COUNTY may accumulate and bill the CITY for incidental material cost.
- 2.2 The CITY will pay for one-half of the COUNTY's fuel used to construct this Project. The COUNTY will invoice the CITY for the fuel consumed at the conclusion of the Project.
- 2.3 The CITY will be responsible for all traffic control necessary to safely construct this project. This responsibility includes all advance notices, signage, barricades, pilot vehicles, and flagmen necessary to control traffic in and around the construction site. The CITY will be responsible for and provide portable message boards to supplement traffic control as needed.
- 2.4 The CITY will make all necessary repairs and preparations to the existing roadway prior to the COUNTY starting work.
- 2.5 The CITY will adjust all utilities, manholes and valve boxes for this Project.
- 2.6 The CITY will provide the COUNTY with a hydrant meter and all the water necessary for construction of the Project at no cost to the COUNTY.
- 2.7 The CITY will provide or pay for any engineering, survey, and laboratory testing required for this Project.
- 2.8 The CITY will furnish a nearby site for dumping all spoils and waste materials generated during construction of this Project.

- 2.9 The CITY will provide the material to backfill the pavement edges for this project.
- 2.10 If required, the CITY will be responsible for the design and development of a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP). The CITY further agrees to pay for all cost (including sub-contractor materials, labor and equipment) associated with the implementation of the plan. The COUNTY will be responsible for maintenance of the plan during the duration of the Project. Documentation and record keeping of the SWPPP will be the responsibility of the CITY.

### **3. PROCEDURES DURING PROJECT**

COUNTY retains the right to inspect and reject all materials provided for this Project.

If the CITY has a complaint regarding the construction of the project, the CITY must complain in writing to the COUNTY no later than 30 days of the date of project completion.

### **4. NO WAIVER OF IMMUNITY**

This Agreement does not waive COUNTY rights under a legal theory of sovereign immunity. This Agreement does not waive CITY rights under a legal theory of sovereign immunity.

### **5. OPTIONAL SERVICES**

- 5.1 If requested by the CITY, the COUNTY will apply permanent striping coordinated through the Transportation Department. Application of striping by the COUNTY is limited to Project roadways. If the CITY desires permanent striping applied to any roadways or portions of roadways not covered by this Agreement, the CITY will need to enter into a separate agreement with the COUNTY for the provision of those services.

**6. TIME PERIOD FOR COMPLETION**

The CITY will give the COUNTY notice to proceed at the appropriate time. However, the COUNTY is under no duty to commence construction at any particular time.

**7. THIRD PARTY**

This contract shall not be interpreted to inure to the benefit of a third party not a party to this contract. This contract may not be interpreted to waive any statutory or common law defense, immunity, including governmental and sovereign immunity, or any limitation of liability, responsibility, or damage of any party to this contract, party's agent, or party's employee, otherwise provided by law.

**8. JOINT VENTURE & AGENCY**

The relationship between the parties to this Agreement does not create a partnership or joint venture between the parties. This Agreement does not appoint any party as agent for the other party.

**9. EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Agreement becomes effective when signed by the last party whose signing makes the Agreement fully executed.

**10. TERMINATION**

This Agreement will automatically terminate on either September 30, 2020 or on the date the project is completed, whichever occurs first. Notwithstanding the foregoing, or any other language to the contrary, either party may terminate this Agreement without cause upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the other party prior to the intended date of termination. In the event of termination by either party, neither party shall have any further obligations to the other party under this Agreement, except that the CITY remains liable to the COUNTY for any outstanding invoice for materials that the COUNTY provides for the project, if any.

**SUMMARY:**

This item is to formally order the General Election for Place 4 and Place 6 on the City Council to be held on Saturday, May 2, 2020. The filing period for this election started Wednesday, January 15 and runs through Friday, February 14. Early voting begins Monday, April 20 and runs through Tuesday, April 28. The main early voting location in Bedford will be the Public Library; however, residents can vote at any Tarrant County early voting location. The main election day voting location in Bedford will be the Pat May Center at 1849B Central Drive; however, residents can vote at any Tarrant County election day location.

**BACKGROUND:**

This resolution is to order the General Election to be held on May 2, 2020 to elect two City Council members, Place 4 and Place 6, to be filled for three years or until their successors are duly elected and qualified. Pursuant to Section 3.005(c) of the Texas Election Code, a city must order its election no later than the 78th day before Election Day, which this year falls on Friday, February 14, 2020.

Early voting begins Monday, April 20 and runs through Tuesday, April 28. The main early voting location in Bedford will be the Public Library; however, residents can vote at any Tarrant County early voting location. The early voting schedule is below:

April 20 - 24	Monday - Friday	8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.
April 25	Saturday	7:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.
April 26	Sunday	11:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Election Day is 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Saturday, May 2, 2020. The main election day voting location in Bedford will be the Pat May Center at 1849B Central Drive; however, residents will be able to vote at any Tarrant County election day location.

A runoff election, if necessary, ensuing from the May 2, 2020 General Election, is tentatively scheduled for June 13, 2020.

As in the past and per state law, staff recommends that this election be held jointly and administered by the Tarrant County Election’s Administration. This has proven to be the most cost effective and efficient way to hold elections. The exact cost of the election is not known at this time and will depend on how many entities end up contracting with the County. Generally, the County will send a cost estimate in April with a finalized total being sent in August.

**SECTION 7. That all resident qualified electors of the City shall be permitted to vote at said election, and on the day of the election, such electors shall vote at the polling place designated for the election precinct in which they reside. This election shall be held and conducted in accordance with the aforesaid election agreement, election laws of the Texas Election Code, the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended, the Charter of the City of Bedford, and as may be required by law. All election materials and proceedings shall be printed in English, Spanish and Vietnamese.**

**SECTION 8. That combined ballots may be utilized containing all of the offices and propositions to be voted on at each polling place, provided that no voter shall be given a ballot or permitted to vote for any office or proposition on which the voter is ineligible to vote. The County's voting equipment will be utilized for this election.**

**SECTION 9. That the Election Judge and officers for each polling place and the Early Voting Ballot Board shall be appointed in accordance with the provisions of the election agreement for the conducting of the election on the aforesaid election date with Tarrant County.**

**SECTION 10. That the Mayor is authorized to execute the aforesaid election agreement for and on behalf of the City.**

**SECTION 11. That the expenses of the joint election shall be borne as outlined in the election agreement with Tarrant County.**

Consider a resolution ordering a special election of the City of Bedford, Texas to be held on Saturday, May 2, 2020 to allow the voters to consider voting for or against the following proposition: the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages.

**City Attorney Review:** Yes

**SUMMARY:**

This item is to formally order a special election to allow the voters to consider voting for or against the following proposition: the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages. This special election would be held in conjunction with the general election for City offices. Early voting begins on Monday, April 20 and runs through Tuesday, April 28. The main early voting location in Bedford will be the Public Library; however, residents can vote at any Tarrant County early voting location. The main election day voting location in Bedford will be the Pat May Center at 1849B Central Drive; however, residents can vote at any Tarrant County election day location.

**BACKGROUND:**

The City of Bedford received a petition meeting the requirements of Chapter 501 of the Texas Election Code related to local option elections on December 27, 2019. The minimum number of valid signatures required to call a local option election was 6,729. Tarrant County Elections performed the petition signature verification using a statistical sampling method pursuant to Section 501.031(a) of the Texas Election Code and confirmed approximately 7,300 valid petition signatures. Once it has been determined that the petition contains the required number of valid signatures, the City Council must order the election at its next regular session occurring 30 days on or after the date the petition was filed with the City Secretary, which is the meeting on January 28, 2020. Additionally, the law requires that local option elections be held on a uniform election date.

Early voting begins on Monday, April 20 and runs through Tuesday, April 28. The main early voting location in Bedford will be the Public Library; however, residents can vote at an Tarrant County early voting location. The early voting schedule is below:

April 20 - 24	Monday - Friday	8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.
April 25	Saturday	7:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.
April 26	Sunday	11:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.
April 27 - 28	Monday – Tuesday	7:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.

Election Day is 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Saturday, May 2, 2020. The main election day voting location in Bedford will be the Pat May Center at 1849B Central Drive; however, residents will be able to vote at any Tarrant County election day location.

As in the past and per state law, staff recommends that this election be held jointly and administered by the Tarrant County Election’s Administration. This has proven to be the most cost effective and efficient way to hold elections. The exact cost of the election is not known at this time and will depend on how many entities end up contracting with the County. Generally, the County will send a cost estimate in April with a finalized total being sent in August. The special election would be held in conjunction with the general election for City offices and therefore, there would not be any additional

costs associated with the contract. There will be some minor costs for translation services and publishing the required notice of election in the Fort Worth Star-Telegram.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends the following motion:

Approval of a resolution ordering a special election of the City of Bedford, Texas to be held on Saturday, May 2, 2020 to allow the voters to consider voting for or against the following proposition: the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

The total estimated cost for this election is \$13,750. This item was budgeted and approved in the FY 2019-2020 budget.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BEDFORD, TEXAS ORDERING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON SATURDAY, MAY 2, 2020 TO ALLOW THE VOTERS TO CONSIDER VOTING FOR OR AGAINST THE FOLLOWING PROPOSITION: THE LEGAL SALE OF ALL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES INCLUDING MIXED BEVERAGES; AUTHORIZING A JOINT CONTRACT ELECTION AGREEMENT AND CONTRACT FOR ELECTION SERVICES WITH TARRANT COUNTY; AND ESTABLISHING THE DATES AND TIMES FOR EARLY VOTING FOR SUCH ELECTION.

WHEREAS, Chapter 501 of the Texas Election Code and Chapter 251 of the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code provide for the holding of local option elections; and,

WHEREAS, Section 501.032 of the Texas Election Code requires the City to order an election upon receipt of a valid petition containing signatures of at least 35 percent of the registered voters in the political subdivision who voted for governor in the most recent gubernatorial election, which equals 6,729 signatures; and,

WHEREAS, on December 27, 2019, the City of Bedford received a petition meeting the requirements of Chapter 501 of the Texas Election Code and containing approximately 7,300 valid signatures requesting a local option election be held for voters to consider voting for or against “the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages”; and,

WHEREAS, all legal prerequisites for the adoption of this resolution have been met, including but not limited to the Election Code, the Alcoholic Beverage Code, the Local Government Code and the Open Meetings Act; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of Bedford, Texas desires to conduct joint elections pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Election Code, and as established in a joint election agreement and contract for election services with the Tarrant County Election Administrator.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEDFORD, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the findings above are found to be true and correct, and are incorporated herein.

SECTION 2. That the City Council of Bedford, Texas, at a regular meeting held this date, does hereby order a special election to be held between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, May 2, 2020, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City of Bedford the determination of the following issue:

*The legal sale of all alcoholic beverages including mixed beverages*

*La venta legal de todas bebidas alcohólicas incluyendo bebidas mixtas*

*Việc bán hợp pháp tất cả đồ uống có nồng độ cồn bao gồm cả đồ uống hỗn hợp*

The ballot shall be prepared so that the voters can vote for or against the above issue.

SECTION 3. That election day voting locations shall be established as outlined in the election agreement with Tarrant County. The election day voting location to be located in the City of Bedford is the Pat May Center, 1849-B Central Drive.

SECTION 4. That Heider Garcia, the Tarrant County Elections Administrator, 2700 Premier Street, Fort Worth, Texas, 76111 is hereby appointed as Early Voting Clerk and Michael Wells, City of Bedford City Secretary, 2000 Forest Ridge Drive, Bedford, Texas, 76021, shall serve as the Deputy Early Voting Clerk. Applications for ballot by mail must be received by mail no later than the close of business on Monday, April 20, 2020 (Mailing Address: P.O. Box 961011, Fort Worth, Texas, 76161-0011; Attn: Early Voting Clerk).
