To minimize exposure, some city buildings will remain closed. Permit services and adoptions with Animal Control are still available by appointment. The Bedford Splash Aquatics Center will be closed for the summer.

To help "slow the spread," the City of Bedford has acquired several surgical masks that will be made available for businesses through the Bedford Economic Development Office.
