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**INFORMATION FOR
TEMPORARY
RV PARKING PERMIT**

- Recreational Vehicles may be located on the City Street provided the RV is placed in-between the side perimeter property lines and adjacent to the property address as indicated on the permit.
- Recreational Vehicles located on the City Street shall not block a driveway, driveway approach or a city sidewalk.
- Recreational Vehicles located on the City Street shall not cause a view obstruction to on-coming traffic at intersections.

CHAPTER 114

Sec. 114-159. - Recreational vehicles parking permit.

(a) Under this section, "*Recreational Vehicle*" means a vehicle measuring not more than 14 feet in height, 9 feet in width, and 45 feet in length, and:

- (1) primarily designed as temporary living quarters for recreational camping or travel use, including a travel trailer, camping trailer, truck camper, and motor home; or
- (2) a boat, trailer, jet ski, or similar equipment.

(b) *Temporary on-street parking permit.* A temporary parking permit for on-street parking for a period of time not to exceed seven (7) days may be issued by the city with the following conditions:

- (1) Allowed only for preparation of use and cleaning.
- (2) May not exceed seven (7) consecutive days. After expiration of a permit, a new permit may not be issued until at least forty-five (45) days have elapsed since the issuance of the previous permit. Not more than three (3) such permits may be issued to a single person or household in a single calendar year.
- (3) Under no circumstance shall the recreational vehicle be occupied for any residential purpose.

Texas Transportation Code

Sec. 545.302 – Stopping, Standing, or Parking Prohibited in Certain Places

(a) An operator may not stop, stand, or park a vehicle:

- (1) on the roadway side of a vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;
- (2) on a sidewalk;
- (3) in an intersection;
- (4) on a crosswalk;
- (5) between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 30 feet of a place on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless the governing body of a municipality designates a different length by signs or markings;
- (6) alongside or opposite a street excavation or obstruction if stopping, standing, or parking the vehicle would obstruct traffic;
- (7) on a bridge or other elevated structure on a highway or in a highway tunnel;
- (8) on a railroad track; or
- (9) where an official sign prohibits stopping.

(b) An operator may not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge a passenger, stand or park an occupied or unoccupied vehicle:

- (1) in front of a public or private driveway;
- (2) within 15 feet of a fire hydrant;
- (3) within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection;
- (4) within 30 feet on the approach to a flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign, or traffic-control signal located at the side of a roadway;
- (5) within 20 feet of the driveway entrance to a fire station and on the side of a street opposite the entrance to a fire station within 75 of the entrance, if the entrance is properly marked with a sign; or
- (6) where an official sign prohibits standing.
